



NATIONAL ATSIM CAMP 2028 TERMS AND CONDITIONS AGREEMENT

In submitting your application and attending the National ATSIM Camp, you consent to the terms and conditions outlined below for yourself and those in your group. A failure to observe these terms and conditions may forfeit your right, and potentially those in your group, to attend ATSIM Camp or the remaining portion of the event.

Fees

- The maximum amount we will hold for ATSIM Camp 2028 fees is \$650.00 per person
- Refund request can only be done once before ATSIM Camp (before 31 August 2027) and there will be a 10% administrative fee.
- If a full refund is requested before 31 August 2027, a new Centrepay agreement will not be created for ATSIM Camp 2028 – fees are to be paid in full.
- All other refunds will be processed AFTER camp, from February 2028.

Behaviour

- You confirm you are a responsible adult and will be responsible and accountable for all your actions and those children of your group.
- You agree to follow all reasonable and lawful directions by Camp Administration, Emergency Personnel and Security Staff.
- The behaviour of those staying on the campground is to be appropriate for a Seventh-day Adventist convention.
- Any musical device or instrument is to be used in a manner not likely to cause annoyance to campers in adjoining sites (cabins, caravans or tents).
- Quietness is to be observed between 10:30 pm and 6:00 am. This includes all cabins, tents, caravans and meeting venues.
- Loud and offensive language is not accepted or tolerated. Offenders may be asked to leave the campgrounds.

Child Safety

- Parents are reminded that the ultimate responsibility for the care of children always remains with parents and/or guardians.
- While there are activities for children at ATSIM Camp, and we endeavour to ensure their safety, ATSIM Camp is not a child-minding facility.
- ATSIM does not take responsibility for caring for children during ATSIM Camp – **your child's absolute safety cannot be guaranteed.**
- Please ensure that the conduct of children and young people in your care is adequately supervised throughout the ATSIM Camp period and that they are fully under the control of their parent and/or guardian between meetings.
- Children who attend an offsite activity and whose behaviour is not appropriate will no longer be able to attend the activity. A parent/guardian must arrange immediate transport from the offsite venue should this occur.
- Children and teenagers under the age of 18 must NEVER be left on the grounds overnight, unsupervised.

Consent to Screening

- In registering for ATSIM Camp, either as a camper or day visitor, you consent to your personal information being screened against Adsafe and other child-protection databases. Those individuals who are listed on child sexual offence registers or are required to have a fellowship agreement to attend

local SDA churches will not be permitted on-site without prior expressed permission by Adsaf and the Australian Union Conference.

Alcohol and Other Drugs

- The campground is designated as an alcohol, nicotine and drug free environment.
- Alcohol is not to be brought onto the campground - offenders will forfeit their rights to be on the grounds.
- Smoking and vaping are not permitted on the campgrounds – offenders will forfeit their rights to be on the grounds.
- Motor vehicles used to bring alcohol or illicit drugs onto the campground will be refused further admittance to the campground for the duration of camp, and potentially further camps.
- If it is found that alcohol, nicotine or illicit drugs are being consumed at a particular campsite, then all occupants of that site will be required to vacate and forfeit all rights to the site and will not be allowed to use the site again for the duration of ATSIM Camp.

Vehicle Parking

- ATSIM and the Australian Union Conference are not liable for any theft or damage to personal vehicles. Attendees are encouraged to purchase their own car insurance policies for such purposes.
- Do not leave any belongings in sight within your vehicle, and make sure cars are locked.
- Cars should be positioned in permitted areas only, according to signs and with consideration of others.
- Vehicles are to be parked as effectively as possible to allow for optimum parking.
- Cars with a valid ACROD/Disability certificate and with eligible passengers (day visitors only) will be allowed to park in the designated area on the campgrounds.
- Please follow the signs and/or parking attendants' instructions.
- Vehicles parked contrary to the terms and conditions may be towed away at the owner's expense.

Movement of Vehicles

- Access to limited areas of the campground is a privilege and not a right. Directions given by Camp Staff are to be obeyed at all times.
- All vehicles are to be removed from the general camping areas by 1.00pm Friday.
- Cars parked alongside caravans, cabins and tents (and within your camp site) are NOT TO BE MOVED during Camp. If movement is necessary, the vehicle on return must be parked outside of the campground and NOT back alongside caravans or private tents.
- During Sabbath hours, other than approved essential services, strictly no vehicular movement will be tolerated on site.
- Speed limits shall be observed at all times, posted or otherwise. I.e, the main driveway = 10 km/h; Carparks and camping areas = 5 km/h (walking pace).
- Motorised wheelchairs and the like must be used only for transporting those with special needs. They are not to be driven by others or for entertainment purposes.
- Motorcycles/bicycles may be ridden only on roadways, similar to cars – i.e: for arrival and departure only and not for recreation. They are NOT to be ridden on the campgrounds from 1.00pm Friday to 1.00pm Monday.

General

- If you are unwell with a contagious virus or disease, such as COVID, you are required to take precautions to limit the spread of the disease. This can include not attending, isolating, face masks etc. This is to help protect other vulnerable attendees from contagion.
- Dogs or other animals/pets are not permitted on the grounds (security dogs or personal assistance dogs excepted upon verification).
- Bicycles, scooters, e-scooters, rip sticks, skateboards and any other forms of wheeled equipment, electronic or otherwise, are not to be used during Camp. If used, these items will be confiscated until the end of camp. Confiscated items can be collected at the end of Camp from the Superintendent's office. (The use of bicycles by Camp and Security Staff is excepted).
- Professional Security assists our voluntary security team in the safety of campers, but it is essential that valuables be cared for properly and not left in tents, cabins or caravans unattended. Please ensure that you look after personal items at all times. ATSIM will not be held liable for the loss, theft or destruction of personal items at ATSIM Camp.

- Ball games and other activities that may injure or offend should be avoided, especially during the Sabbath hours.
- Camp hygiene and cleanliness is the responsibility of all campers. You are encouraged to deposit all litter into the bins provided and ensure all camping areas are kept tidy and presentable at all times.
- Lost Property: All lost property should be handed into the Superintendent's Office (or registration office?) with a report of where the item was found and in what condition.

Photography At ATSIM Camp

Most people taking photos of children at ATSIM Camp are doing so for acceptable reasons and using appropriate methods. However, it is worth noting that many photographs taken in public places will include subjects who have not consented to their photo being taken. In Australia, generally speaking, there is no law restricting photography of people (including children) in public spaces as long as the images are;

- Not considered indecent
- Not being used for voyeurism
- Not being used for commercial purposes without a Model Release/Consent.

Where an event is held on private property, such as ATSIM Camp at Mornington Adventure Park, the owners of the private property are able to restrict or ban photography. Understanding this, ATSIM requests that you adhere to the following guidelines when it comes to the formation of photography at ATSIM Camp:

- Authorised photographers have been employed to take photographs at ATSIM Camp. They will be wearing a staff lanyard. If you do not wish your child to be photographed by the photographer for any reason, please contact the Camp Office and identify the children.
- If you are taking photographs that include minors, please endeavour to restrict the images to those children that are related or known specifically to you.
- Due to child protection issues, photos of children at camp, other than those that are directly related to you, should not be posted onto the internet, social networking sites or any other form of electronic carriage service.
- Mobile phones with photographic ability and cameras are not to be used inside the amenity blocks. If you have concerns about inappropriate photographic behaviour or content, please report to the Camp Superintendent.
- If persons are found to be taking photographs inappropriately, ATSIM Camp Administration will request that the person stop, and/or take appropriate action given the circumstances. If the person refuses, the police or security will be called to escort the person from the property.
